Some of these provenance statements may be uncertain for reasons explained in the relevant catalogue records. This index lists all people and institutions for which an ownership has been suggested regardless of certainty. If manuscripts are listed twice per entry (e.g. Medieval 143 / Middle East & Asia 143), it means that there are catalogue records for that manuscript in both catalogues.

Personal ownership is listed by last name and first name(s) with some exceptions for medieval names, which often do not have last names. Dates in round brackets provide years of the birth and/or death or known activity (*fl.*). Centuries in square brackets, such as [s. xiv], refer to palaeographical dating of the provenance inscription. Donors of manuscripts to St John's marked by asterisks (*) before names.

Institutional ownership is marked by a light blue background. The institutions are listed by modern city/ town followed by institution name; where possible the same designations as in *Medieval Libraries of Great Britain* (<http://mlgb3.bodleian.ox.ac.uk/> [accessed 31/10/2022]) are used.
